TIPS TO KEEP YOUR PROPERTY FREE OF TRESPASSERS

Take the below measures to prevent trespassers from ever thinking about entering your land.

Always approach a trespasser with caution. If they don't mind breaking the law, they could also be dangerous.

SIGNS, SIGNS, EVERYWHERE A SIGN

Post signs about every 50 yards along the borders of your property.

KNOW YOUR NEIGHBORS

Introduce yourself to all of your neighbors. Let them know you are keeping a close eye on your property and you plan to respect all property boundaries.

OUT OF SIGHT, OUT OF MIND

Plant borders around your property so potential trespassers cannot see into your property. For example, a nice combination of trees, shrubs, and warm season perennial grasses should work.

BE CAREFUL WHO YOU TELL

Be careful who you boast in front of.
Word of a huge buck travels fast. The
enticement to harvest a big, mature
whitetail buck can trigger some to
break the law.

SMILE - YOU'RE ON MY CAMERA

To prosecute a trespasser all you need is a clear, identifiable photo of the trespasser in the act. Use more trail cameras on the trails and access points.

Your trail cameras are stationary monitors, but what happens when you run into someone in person? You can always try to capture a picture on your smartphone.
